COHORT EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

COHORT will be governed by an Executive Committee (EXCO) consisting of an elected Chairperson, Deputy Chairperson and between three and five elected members.

COHORT PROGRAMMES

Plenary Meetings

COHORT will host two plenary meetings per annum where all members will be expected to attend. During the plenary, issues of governance will be discussed including financials, and possible projects that the committee can adopt as part of its programme of action. Dates of the two plenary meetings per annum are pre-arranged and fixed, and the scheduling of Ministerial meetings are guided by the availability of the Minister of Science and Technology.

Attendance

The meetings are attended by heads of organisations and not their delegates. In the exceptional case of a delegate attending COHORT meetings, the delegate must be given the necessary proxy for decision making by the relevant head of organisation.
